Information

Hibbing Community College is pleased to offer our 18th annual College for Kids program. The program is available to children between the ages of 7 – 12. We have put together a mix of existing and new exciting classes that we hope will surprise our returning students and interest our new ones. There is something for everyone.

Dates & Times: College For Kids 2011 will be held the week of July 25 – July 29, 2011, Monday through Friday. Classes will begin at 9:00 a.m. and end at 3:30 p.m. daily. All classes will be held at Hibbing Community College. Please notice some classes do have fieldtrips. If your child is attending a class with a field trip, a parent must sign a permission slip authorizing their involvement.

Tuition: The cost for the entire week is \$95. Payment must accompany the registration. The tuition includes all classes, lunch and snacks for the entire week, as well as required materials. Scholarships are available based on availability and financial status, call for an application.

Registration: Each student will attend one class during each section. They will attend the same five classes each day, in the same order, for the entire week. Make sure your child is registered in the correct age group. It is essential to rank selections (1st choice, 2nd choice ...) in each section, in case your first (or second) choice is already filled. Registration will be accepted on a first come first serve basis. Registration and tuition can be dropped off at the HCC Continuing Education Department. It is important to list two (2) emergency numbers in case there is a need to reach a parent during College for Kids. Please be sure to sign the release form on the backside of the registration form. If you need to pick up your child early or they arrive late any time during the week, please check in at the Key Club Desk located at the check in area. **Classes fill quickly, register early!**

Discipline & Refund Policies: Parents of excessively disruptive children will be contacted. If misbehavior continues, students will be asked to leave the program. There are no refunds. You may cancel your registration any time up to one week prior to the beginning of classes (July 18) and receive a 75% refund. No refunds thereafter.
